Adrian Covert
Senior Vice President Public Policy
Bay Area Council

Adrian Covert is Senior Vice President of Public Policy for the Bay Area Council, providing research and advocacy leadership for the Council's committees on Homelessness, Water & Resilience, Commuter Shuttles, and Advanced Communications Infrastructure. Covert has lead numerous successful Bay Area Council initiatives, including legislation to update California's water data

systems, regulations over San Francisco's growing commuter shuttle system, and voter-approval of regional Measure AA, a first-of-its-kind regional measure that raises \$500 million for wetland restoration and flood protection projects in the San Francisco Bay. Covert is also leading the Council's California Climate Resilience Challenge and is a member of the Executive Board of Resilient by Design.

Prior to joining the Council, Adrian served on the research and communications team for Repair California: Californians for a State Constitutional Convention, and received a Bachelor of Arts degree in political science from San Francisco State University. Adrian plays baseball in the Pacific Coast Hardball League, and writes about old bars, including authoring the 2016 book "Tayerns of the American Revolution."



Scott Wiener
District 11 Senator
CA State Government

Scott Weiner was elected in November 2016. Senator Scott Wiener represents District 11 in the California State Senate. District 11 includes all of San Francisco, Broadmoor, Colma, and Daly City, as well as portions of South San Francisco.

In the Senate, Senator Wiener works to make housing more affordable, invest in our transportation systems, increase access to healthcare, support working families, meaningfully address climate change and the impacts of wildfires, reform our criminal justice system, reduce gun violence, reduce California's high poverty rate, and safeguard and expand the rights of all communities, including immigrants and the LGBTQ community.

Senator Wiener has authored 42 bills that have been signed into law. Among them are SB 35, a landmark law to streamline housing approvals in cities not meeting their housing goals; SB 855, which makes California the national leader in mental health and addiction care access by requiring insurance companies to cover all medically necessary mental health and substance use disorder treatments; SB 822, which enacts the strongest net neutrality protections in the nation; SB 1045 and SB 40, which expand and strengthen California's conservatorship laws to help individuals who are living on our streets with severe mental health and substance use disorders; SB 700, the largest investment in clean energy storage in California history; SB 923, which modernizes California's eyewitness identification standards to ensure innocent people are not sent to prison; SB 136, which reduces mass incarceration by repealing California's most commonly used sentence enhancement; SB 219, which protects LGBTQ seniors in long-term care facilities; SB 159, which allows pharmacists to provide PrEP and PEP (powerful HIV prevention medications) without a physician's prescription; and SB 132, which requires prisons to house transgender incarcerated individuals according to where they're safest (for example, by gender identity).

Elizabeth was one of the early pioneers in impact investing. She founded the Dignity Fund in 2004, one of the first for-profit funds mobilizing investment capital for the microfinance industry. She later created Dignity Capital to continue her impact investing efforts. For several years she served as Chairman of the Board of Unitus, one of the world's most innovative microfinance accelerators.

Since that time, she has been a tireless advocate for the impact investing movement, serving as a fund manager for several impact funds, a mentor to social entrepreneurs, and an angel investor. She currently serves as the Senior GP at Dev Equity, an impact fund investing in economic development in Latin America. About half of Dev Equity's portfolio is invested in low-income housing in impoverished regions across Honduras, Panama, and Ecuador.

Elizabeth started her career as a Product Manager for Microsoft Word and on the founding team of Microsoft Office. She joined Yahoo! as one of the earliest employees, and was a co-founder of Yahoo! Shopping, among other Yahoo! services. Elizabeth was responsible for business development and strategic planning for services such as Yahoo! Finance, Search, Auctions, Greetings, Travel, and others. Elizabeth was President and CEO of CML Global Capital, a publicly traded investment conglomerate based in Canada. As CEO she oversaw several major transactions and eventually a privatization of the corporation.

Elizabeth has been actively involved in homelessness in California for nearly two decades. She served on the board and chaired Glide Memorial's Community Housing initiative, which built two buildings for the formerly homeless in San Francisco's Tenderloin District. She now serves on the board of LifeMoves, a leading homelessness services organization in Silicon Valley as well as on the real estate advisory board of HomeRise, a permanent supportive housing developer in San Francisco.

Elizabeth has served on or chaired over a dozen nonprofit and social enterprise boards including South Pacific Development Bank, Uchu (Ecuador), Candid, Root Capital, Ujjivan Small Finance Bank, Deutsche Bank's Microfinance Consortium and FINCA's microfinance fund.

She is an active member of Young Presidents' Organization where she served on the International Board, co-founded the impact networks, and now chairs the YPO Impact Investing Initiative. She is a member of Toniic (an impact investors network) and Battery Powered, among many other prominent impact-focused organizations.

Elizabeth holds an undergraduate degree in International Relations and Economics with Honors from Stanford University and an MBA from Harvard Business School as a Baker Scholar.
